



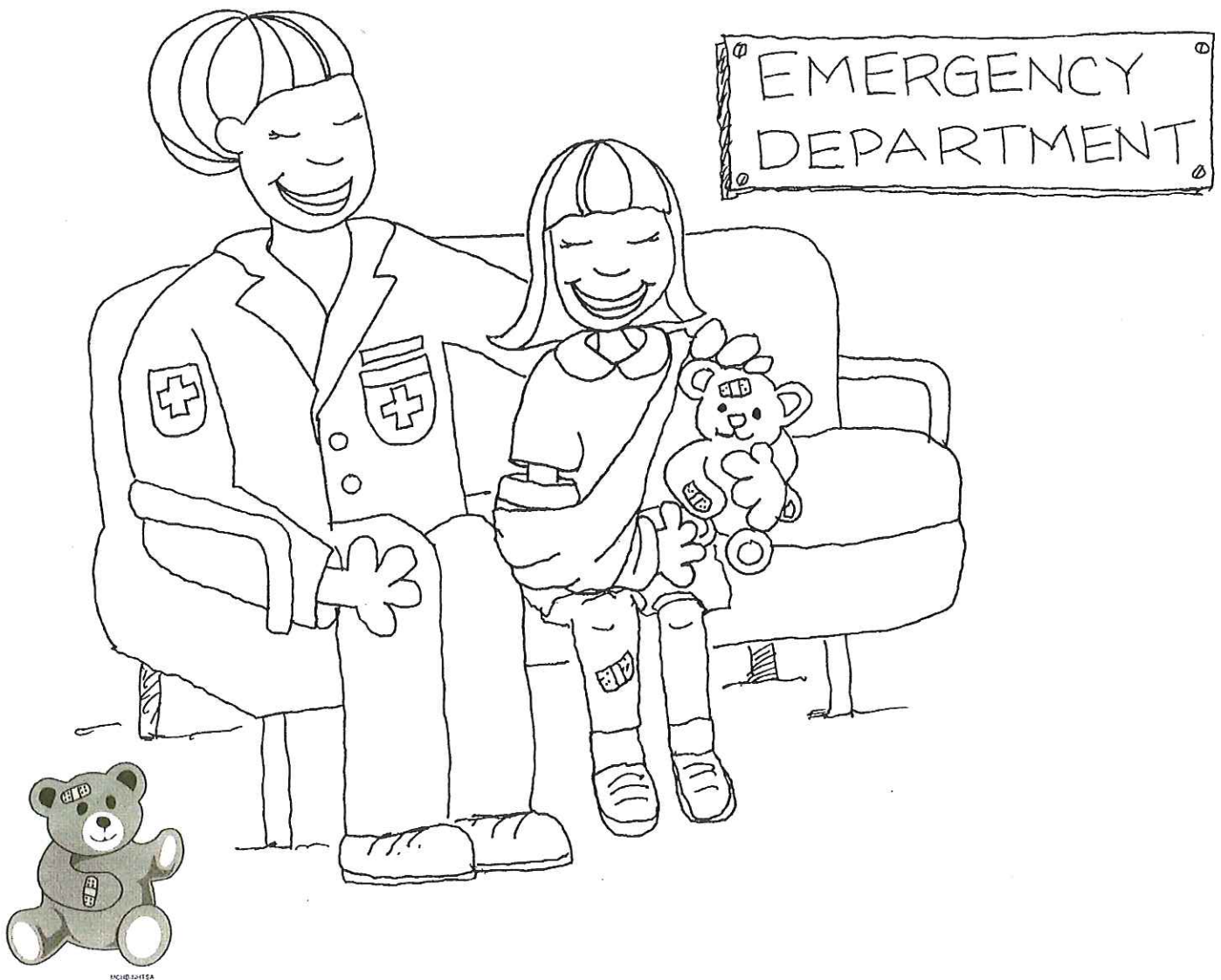

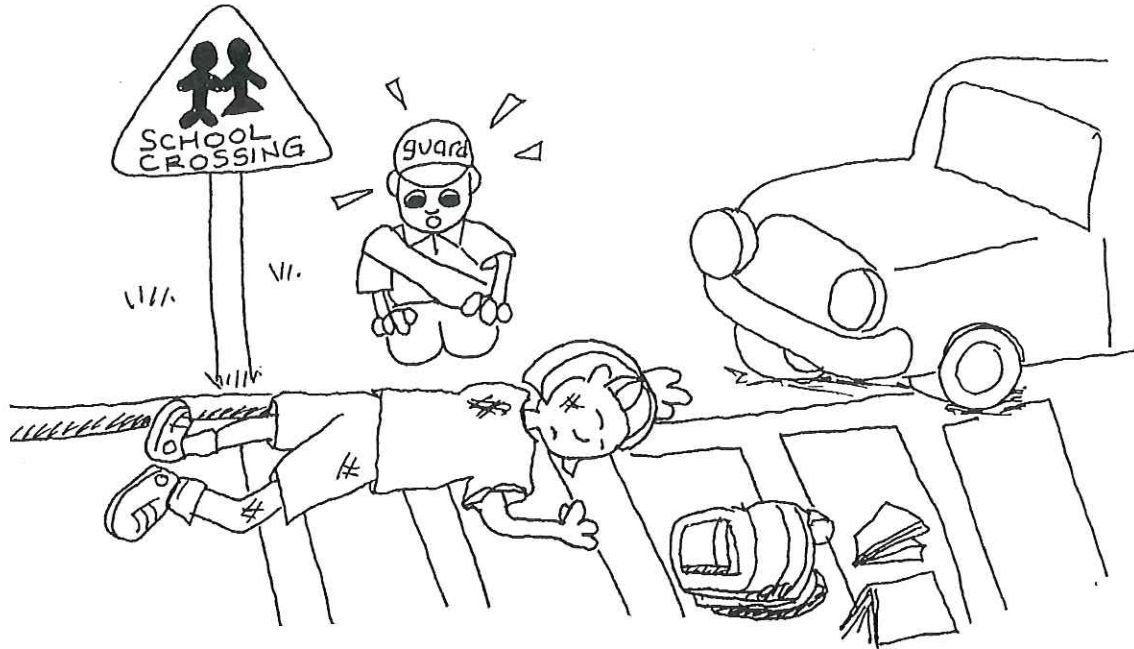

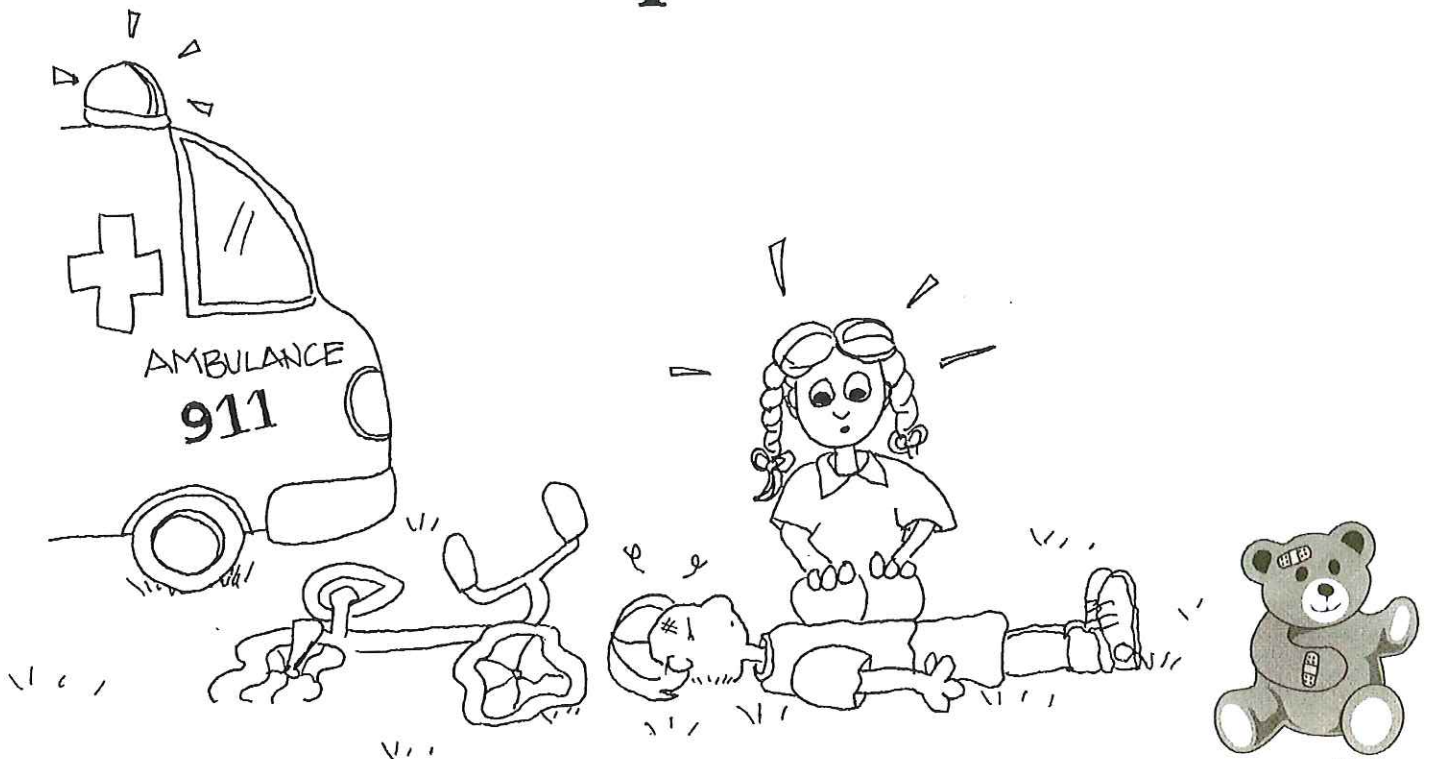
**It can be scary when

who is hurt, call 911.**

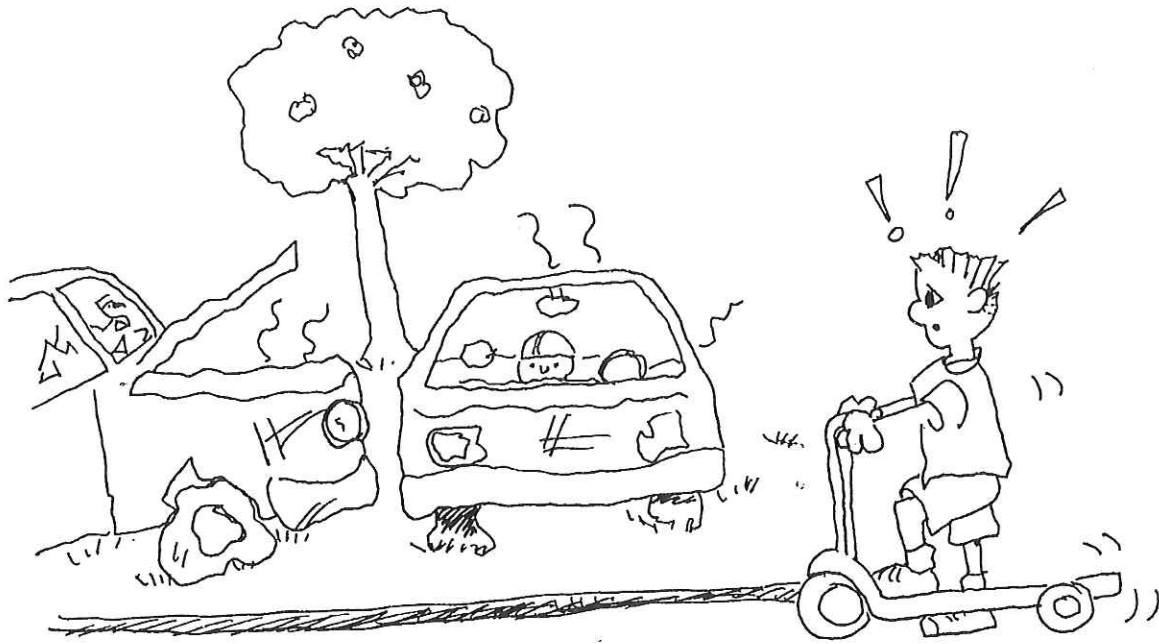


**If someone is in trouble  
and needs help, call 911.**





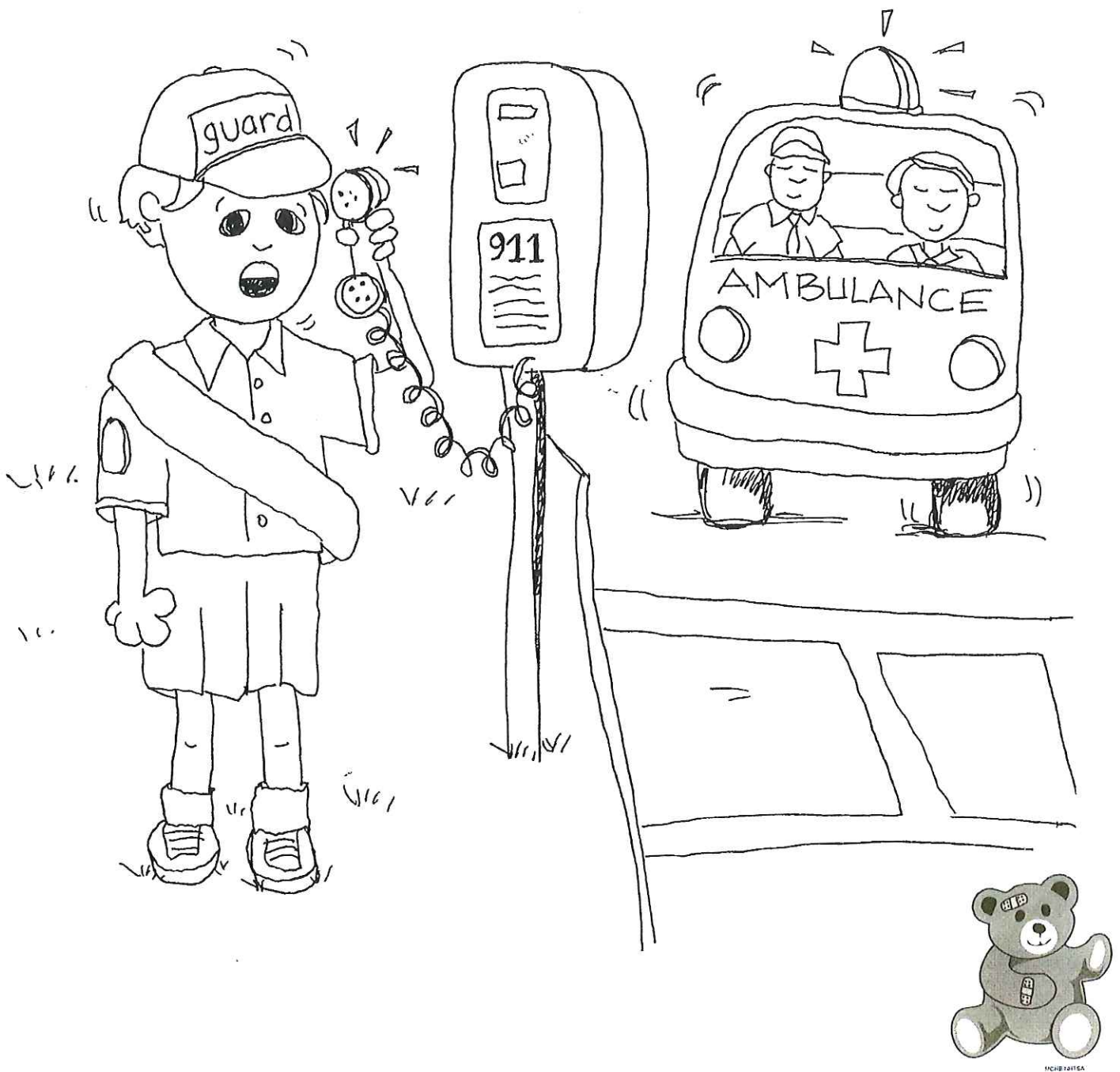
**If you see a car crash, call 911.**

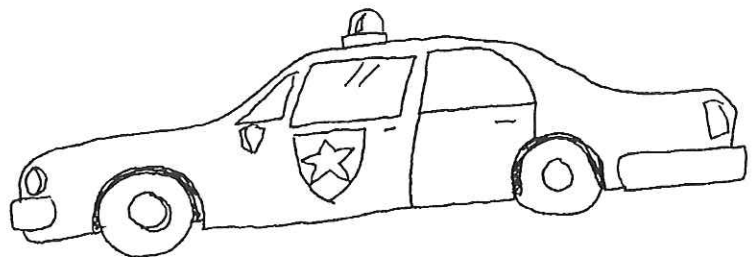
